



What we learn.....

Class Curriculum: This year in Animal Science you will be learning about many different aspects of the agricultural industry including animal genetics, anatomy, physiology, nutrition, disease, pests, and management practices. We will plan your Supervised Agriculture Experience (SAE); and develop your personal leadership skills through the FFA Organization.

Animal Science is part of a complete Agriculture Program at Springville High School. Learning about FFA is an intra-curricular portion of this class and will be taught and participation in Springville FFA Chapter will be encouraged according to the state standards and objectives

Earning a grade....

Daily Points: You will receive 10 participation points per day if you are in class on time and participate. Points will be docked for tardiness or failure to follow rules and procedures. These points will be earned through daily journal logs. You will receive a maximum of 5 out of 10 possible participation points for each day you are tardy. Only excused absences can make up these points.

Tests, Quizzes, and Grades: I will give 2-3 days notice before giving a test, but quizzes are unannounced. If students miss a test they will have 7 days to make it up. Tests can **ONLY** be made up in the testing center on Wednesday's early out day. (NOTE: students need to show picture id at the testing center) We will throughout the year be working with live animals as well as animal specimens as part of the learning process – students will be expected to participate and will be given notice as to when that will be.
