Makeup Work- *There is no makeup of oral quizzes!!! If you miss a homework assignment it must be made up within five days of the students return and is only worth 75% of the amount possible. If you miss an exam it must be made up the next time the student is in class.*

Attendance- Attendance is very important. If you are not in class it is very hard to receive a good grade. If you are school excused I consider you in class. If you have a death in the family, you are ill or at a doctor's appointment, or some other special need come and talk to me. Communication is the best policy.

Grades- Grades are determined by the total amount of points accumulated by the end of each term. The number possible for each exam, quiz, or assignment will be determined by the highest score in the class. Keep a total in your notebook of each score you receive and the possible so you know at all times what your grade is.
