INTRODUCTION

This is a one semester “supplemental” science course that will earn 0.5 credits which counts towards the 3 science credits needed to meet current Utah High School graduation requirements. Remember, 2 of the science credits must come from “foundation” level courses. This is not a foundation level course as defined by the Utah State Office of Education. There is a \$10 science lab fee for this class (as per school board policy), please pay at finance office and turn in a copy of receipt to your science teacher.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: (1 semester elective science credit)

This will be an introductory level course exploring the basics of astronomy. Topics to be studied will include: the methods and historical development of astronomy, the composition of our solar system, theories of solar system formation, the celestial sphere, constellations, life cycle of stars, structure and dynamics of the universe, our sun, Earth and moon, time, tides, eclipses, planets, our galaxy and beyond. Reference materials include the course textbook “Discovering the Universe” Comins and Kaufmann, “Starry Night” software, web based research, current science articles and student notes.

GRADES: Your grades will be based on a percentage of the total points possible. Points will be earned through tests, quizzes, labs, and other assigned activities. The grading scale is as follows:
