Discussion about Trust Lands Plan for 2022-2023 School Year

A discussion was held about next year's plan and sending out a survey to students was suggested to get more information on what they would like to see as far as what motivates them here at school. The council thought it would be good information to have to develop a plan for next year.

School News and updates from the principal

Robert shared that the school has begun a plan to help keep students in class and out of the halls. Part of this plan includes hall pass for all teachers to use, passes for the

photo and video class that are different from the hall pass so faculty knows they are in the hall for a purpose, teachers standing by their doors when possible between classes, as well as administration and others walking the halls during class and making sure students are where they need to be.

A new bell schedule began in the 3rd term at the high school. The bells now ring on the 5s and 10s to make it easier to remember for students, staff, and parents.

Parking was discussed and the need for students to park in student parking. The school has purchased a boot for students who violate parking numerous times to try to ensure visitors and staff have parking when they come to the school.

Other items from Council members

A few items were brought up from council members in regards to being able to check student credit for graduation and if they are on track to graduate.

It was discussed that a canvas course could possibly be taught or added to students' canvas courses that would help give the students information about college scholarships and applications such as due dates etc.

Free periods for students were talked about and the reasons for why students may have those. It was discussed how we could encourage students to take class and not have free periods.
